Note: Bolded name is that of the sole survivor of this airplane crash. TSgt. Marvin H. Jacobs was thrown clear of the wreckage and ensuing fire, and sustained only minor injuries. He was soon found and rescued by a hunter from a nearby tribal village who witnessed the crash while he was hunting in the area. The hunter built a bamboo lean-to shelter for Jacobs and cared for him, while a runner was sent from the village to notify the US Army. The villagers then built a rough airstrip so the Americans could recover Jacobs with a small airplane.
