ON 24 APRIL 1943 PRIVATE FIRST CLASS MERVYN E. SIMS WAS AMONGST THE CREW OF A C-87 LIBERATOR EXPRESS THAT DISAPPEARED DURING A FLIGHT OVER THE HIMALAYAS. THE CREW OF FIVE WAS RETURNING TO CHABUA, INDIA FROM YANGKAI, CHINA. ALL ATTEMPTS TO LOCATE THE AIRCRAFT WERE UNSUCCESSFUL. IN 1946 THE U.S. WAR DEPARTMENT DECLARED THE 5 MEN PRESUMED DEAD, AND THE AMERICAN GRAVES REGISTRATION SERVICE DECLARED THE REMAINS NON-RECOVERABLE. ALL FIVE CREWMEN ARE NAMED ON THE TABLETS OF THE MISSING, MANILA AMERICAN CEMETERY AND MEMORIAL, REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES.

ON 19 OCTOBER 2003 CLAYTON KUHLES, AN AMERICAN CITIZEN IN BURMA REPORTED THAT HE FOUND THE WRECKAGE AND RECOVERED HUMAN REMAINS. AIRCRAFT IDENTIFICATION WAS THE DATA PLATE, TAIL NUMBER 41–23696.

ON 27 MAY 2009 BONE SAMPLES WERE SUBMITTED TO THE ARMED FORCES DNA IDENTIFICATION LAB AND MERVYN WAS POSITIVELY IDENTIFIED BY DNA OBTAINED FROM HIS SISTER, VIRGINIA BURCH.

JOINT POW/MIA ACCOUNTING COMMAND (JPAC) HAS SOUGHT PERMISSION TO RETURN TO THE RECOVERY SITE; THE INDIAN GOVERNMENT HAS RESTRICTED ACCESS TO THAT AREA.

20 APRIL 2011 MERVYN E. SIMS WAS ESCORTED FROM HICKAM AFB. HAWAII TO CYPRESS HILLS MEMORIAL PARK TO JOIN HIS FAMILY.
